MINUTES OF THE REGULAR WARREN CITY COUNCIL MEETING

March 10, 2025

5:30 p.m.

OPENING PRAYER: Opening prayer was led by Reverend Rochell, West Central Church of Christ, Warren, AR.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Reep led the Council and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Gregg Reep called the meeting to order. The meeting was held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building.

Minutes of February 10, 2025, regular City Council Meeting: On a motion made by Council Member Henderson and a second by Council Member Moseley the Council voted 6-0 to approve the minutes of February 10, 2025. City Clerk's Report

Financial Statement: City Clerk Janice Nelson provided the Financial Report to the City Council Members in their packets for review. J. **Parks & Recreation -Director: Kyle Wagon:** The Parks & Recreation report for February 2025 was presented to the Council. Mr. Wagon was at the ball complex as the baseball and softball season has arrived.

K. **Community and Economic Development Committee – Council Member-Chairman**

Hooper: Council Member Hooper mentioned that the employees that were running the shooting range had quit. Mayor Reep stated that the city was keeping the shooting range up and running and it would be available for anyone that wanted to rent it. The shooting range is currently open Thursday, Friday and Saturday afternoons. The city will be advertising for replacements to take over the positions.

1. **Cultural Center Update:** Mayor Reep stated that the city was actively trying to find grants to assist with the Cultural Center but nothing new at this time.

2. **Depot Kitchen & Renovations & Old Street Shop:** The windows have been repaired with the plexiglass. At this point all funds that were allocated for the depot renovations have been exhausted. The city is looking for chairs and tables for each building at an acceptable price. A request to have appliances supplied for Depot by donation from a local business has been made and is now being reviewed by the business financial department. The city is currently shopping around for chairs for the Armory. The old street shop is

proceeding on schedule, the bathroom fixtures have been completed, and the floor is ready for concrete and Council Member Burks-Frazer has agreed to paint the interior of the building. Council Member Hooper made a motion to have the street shop rental be \$175.00 a day with the other rental facilities remaining at the current rate but raising the deposit from \$100.00 to \$125.00 for all rental facilities. Council Member Henderson seconded. The Council voted 6-0 to approve the old street shop rental of \$175.00, keep the current rates for the other rental facilities and raise the deposit for all rentals to \$125.00. Yes votes – Council Members Hooper, Henderson, Atkins, Burks-Frazer, Moseley and Tolefree. Nay – none. Absent – none. Council Member Hooper motioned to have the rental agreements updated, made available online as well as a paper copy, with all information gather put into a monthly report; Council Member Burks-Frazer seconded. The Council voted 6-0 to approve putting the rental agreements online as well as having a paper copy and presenting the Community Economic Development Chairperson in a monthly report all rental information. L. Ways and Means Committee-Council Member-Chairman Henderson: Chairman Henderson stated the Ways and Means Committee had met on March 23, 2025.

1. Land Purchase: (Pennington Property): Council Member Henderson motioned to authorize Mayor Reep, to move forward in developing a contract lease agreement with the BCEDC for BCEDC purchase the Pennington property through the Arkansas Development Authority and for the first and second year of the payments will be paid one half by the BCEDC and one half by the City of Warren(the city's part would come from the Community and Economic Development). Also, the land negotiation be agreed upon by the Warren City Council, the Mayor of Warren and the BCEDC to include selling, leasing or donating the land and that the land contractional lease agreement be reviewed by an independent law firm and by the Arkansas Municipal League. Council Member Tolefree seconded. The Council voted 4-2 to approve developing a contractional lease agreement with BCEDC to purchase the Pennington property. Yes votes – Council Members Henderson, Tolefree, Moseley and Hooper. Nay – Council Members Atkins and Burks-Frazer. Absent – none. Motion carried.

2. New Revenue Tax for Safety: Council Member Henderson motioned to authorize Mayor Reep of the City of Warren to move forward to initiating and executing the process for a new revenue tax "safety tax" to be put on the ballot for the city taxpayers to consider and vote on; Council Member Tolefree seconded the morion. The Council voted 6-0 to approve authorizing Mayor Reep to initiate and execute the process for a new revenue tax to be placed on the ballot for taxpayers to vote on. Yes votes – Council Members Henderson, Tolefree, Atkins, Burks-Frazer, Moseley and Hooper. Nay votes – none. Absent – none. Motion carried.

3. School East Lab Safe Haven Baby Box: Council Member Henderson motioned to authorize Mayor Reep to move forward with a contractional agreement with the East Lab Students for a "Safe Haven Baby Box" to be placed at the Warren Fire Station utilizing \$7,500 of

grant money along with \$7,500.00 of private donations with the City providing up front funds. The city will be reimbursed for the total of \$15,000.00 from the East Lab Students and the grant; Council Member Hooper seconded. The Council voted 6-0 to approve the mayor to initiate a contractual agreement with the East Lab students for providing the funds up front for the placement of the Safe Haven Baby Box. Yes votes – Council Members Henderson, Hooper, Atkins, Burks-Frazer, Moseley and Tolefree. Nay – none. Absent – None. Motion carried.


